Master of Civil Engineering

The Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering at the University of South Florida, is pleased to offer its Master of Civil Engineering (MCE) program designed for engineers working full time in the Tampa area.

Requirements:

- 30 credit hours
- *Courses may be taken over a 6 year period.
- *The degree is based on course work only without a thesis requirement.

Students can specialize in:

- Structural
- Materials
- Environmental
- Water Resources
- Transportation
- Geotechnical

Recommended Format:

- 6 Major Area courses
- 2 Technical Electives
- 2 Additional Technical Electives or Professional Development courses

Details:

- The American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) recommends a Master's Degree.
- Beginning in 2015, a Master's degree will be required for licensure as a professional engineer (PE).
- Tuition is often paid by the employer.
- Professional development courses such as Principles of Engineering Management can be taken from the Department of Industrial Engineering or from the College of Business Administration.
- Curriculum can include courses offered by the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering or courses offered by other departments at USF.
- Students can use two undergraduate 4000 level courses.

Support:

- The Department can usually support MS Students with a Teaching Assistantship or Research Assistantship.
- When a student is supported on a research assistantship, he/she is paid for helping a professor on the professor's research contracts.
